Air France takes delivery of its fifth A350-900

On May 6th, Air France took delivery of its fifth A350-900 from the Toulouse Airbus factory (registered F-HTYE, named BORDEAUX), thanks to a unique mobilization of all stake-holders during unprecedented COVID-19 conditions. The delivery of the A350-900 in Toulouse was indeed made possible through the outstanding commitments of technical teams from Airbus and Air France.

With an order book of 38 aircraft, the A350-900 is the cornerstone in the redesign of Air France's long haul fleet. With 324 seats in the Air France's three cabin configuration, the aircraft offers unparalleled customer experience, higher efficiency and reduced carbon emissions in line with Air France's strategy.

The financing of the aircraft has been provided under a JOLCO (Japanese Operating Lease with Call Option) structure arranged by Société Générale, with Société Générale and Crédit Industriel et Commercial as Senior Co-Lenders. On top of the recently announced State-guaranteed loan to Air France-KLM, this financing comes as a testimony of the strong support given to Air France by its core relationship banks in this unprecedented period. This support will allow Air France to continue its strategic investments in fleet renewal and meet its environmental targets.
